- Request transcript (\$2 fee-cash only) from Registrar Office (**at least 10 days in advance**)

The contest caps off with a final round that decides the three top finishers. Speeches are eight to 10 minutes long; three- to five-minute speeches on an assigned topic also are part of the contest. The overall national contest winner gets an \$18,000 scholarship.
